450 hungry rainbow trout provided by Blue Den Ranch hatchery of Scio provided very good fishing indeed. As evidenced in these photos, we had three eight-hour days of non-stop fishing and fun.



The show sponsor was thrilled that the kid's fishing pond was one of the most popular events at the show, as evidenced by the continuous long line of anxious, high energy, future anglers waiting to fish. This effect continued throughout all three days of the show (estimate +350 kids total).



Twenty-five of the fish were tagged and each time one was caught, the lucky angler received a new Diawa rod and spinning reel (donated by Team Diawa). How is that for planting the seed to make more future anglers? Surprisingly, only eight tagged fish were caught in three days, and thus, only eight prizes were awarded!



The 1500-gallon fish tank delivery was arranged through Kyle Smith and delivered by Robert Burk and Doug Loose (McLaughlin Chapter members) who provided aid to set it up properly . Their assistance and knowledge of using this equipment added greatly to Mid-Valley Chapter's ability to succeed.
